### NEWS FROM OUR COMMUNITIES

#### LOYOLA COLLEGE, CHENNAI

Loyola Hostel celebrated Enviro Fest on Oct. 2. Under the leadership of **Fr. M. J. Mahalingam**, Loyola College observed September 9 as the Black Flag Day to draw the attention of the Union Government to the persistent demand of Dalit Christians and Muslims for the last 63 years to give them Scheduled Caste status. The staff and the students wore black badges throughout the day and took active part in the signature campaign and slogan shouting. During the public meeting held inside the campus the speakers enlightened the audience about their legitimate demand. As the director of LISSTAR, Fr. Mahalingam organized a one-day workshop on Writing and Publishing Articles in National and International Journals. Seventy-six

teachers from different Universities from South India participated.

**Fr. K. Amal** delivered the convocation address on Oct. 3<sup>rd</sup> to the new graduates of Loyola - Puduva College of Education run by the socially committed Alumni of Loyola College. He expatiated on the budding teachers' need to develop enough self-confidence to be willing to 'learn from the students' while being determined to build up students' self-esteem.

### LICET, CHENNAI

The formal inauguration of Loyola-ICAM College of Engineering and Technology (LICET) was held on Oct 27<sup>th</sup>. The Chief Minister **Mr. Karunanidhi** presided over the function and formally inaugurated it. The Union Minister **Dayanidhi Maran**, Education Ministers **Ponmudi** and **Thangam Thennarasu**, VC of Anna University, **Fr Vincent Chinnadurai**, MPs including **T.R. Xavier**, indicated the origin and milestones of LICET and thanked the Tamil Nadu Government for their encouragement and support to start recently four educational institutions in the Chennai Mission (Loyola College at Vettavalam, Loyola Teacher Training Institute at Kuppayanallur, Loyola College of Education and LICET in Loyola Campus). **Dr Jose**, the Principal, proposed the vote of thanks. **Fr Joe Arun** was the effective MC with his energetic organization of the programme.

### **KALANGARAI, NAGAPATTINAM**

Four workshops each for five days were organized on productive skills for 110 people in collaboration with BWDA – Bullock cart workers’ Association based in Villupuram.

One three-day workshop was conducted for the school-going children of widows and deserted women paving the way to help them to come out of their psychological blocks, to understand and feel with their widowed mothers and join hands with their mothers in their fight for the rights of widows and deserted women. Listening to the experiences of such marginalized children is itself an experience of spiritual nature.

Another such workshop on the “Impact of Globalization on Women” was organized for the staff of Kalangarai. **Frs. Anbarasan, A. Irudayaraj** and **Sr. Flora** took sessions on the various aspects of Globalization with a special focus on women living at the bottom of the society.

With the intention of evolving a cultural troupe of our own which would carry forward the cause of Widows’ and deserted women to the general public, two training workshops were organized for a group of 15 members. **Mr. Vincent** from Chennai is involved in the process.

More than 140 widows and deserted women actively participated in a two-day convention and public meeting organized in Nagapattinam by the Tamil Nadu Dalit Women’s Front. The convention condemned the atrocities inflicted on Dalit women across the country. Kalangarai staff extended their support in all possible ways.
